#### From the Pro.....

**Keeping Score** 

It seems that keeping score is often the reason people have less fun golfing than they could. Golf usually offers wonderful company and environment--what else can we ask of our recreation? Very few people's income or status is based on their score, so don't give it undue importance or let it ruin your free time or others' recreation. Most players would much prefer to play with a happy hacker instead of a grumpy pro.



My friend Betty taught me a great scoring system for newer golfers. She simply counted how many good shots she hit each day for several years--the more good shots, the happier she was. This system and some nice playing partners kept her coming back. She now keeps score "normally" and just celebrated her career score (44 for 9 holes), a great achievement for someone who started in her 60's.

Better players have many ways to evaluate their round other than score. Players seeking consistency can track how few penalty strokes or lost balls they have in a round; another benchmark would be to try to not make worse than net bogey on any hole for the day. If one of these systems increases your enjoyment of the game--great! Every once in a while, a player will be "in the zone", simply hitting each shot and ignoring their score. They are usually amazed how low their score is at the end of their round because score has not complicated an already difficult game. Celebrate these days, but remember that your average score is still about the same. The bottom line is that fun is much more important than your score.




Harbor, we all pretty much took naps on the 5:35 ferry home.
