The players, Debbie and I are sincerely grateful for all you did and do.

Monday May 20th Good evening to all.

The players are in bed, exhausted after two long, long days. They did some homework last night and this morning, with conclusion of practice past 8:00 PM yesterday and right at 6:30

tonight. Tough course, tougher than last year, but some beautiful play and phenomenal putting by all. Tee times are still on for tomorrow with tough weather in the forecast. The players have the skills, there is no doubt. Let's help them now to play proudly and with integrity; the scores will fall where they should.

Tuesday May 21st Good evening. Back in from a busy day at the course; we spent almost ten hours there today.

Playing through another downpour, the ladies golf team earned third place at the State Championship, finishing tied for 9th place and earning 22 points. Sarah Reeve followed her 105 of Tuesday with a 101 today, while Marné Cook shot 108 today after having a 98 yesterday.

Final Overall State Report: On the second day at the B/BB State Tournament, the combined scores of Marné Cook and Sarah Reeve earned them a tie for 9th place and allowed them to secure 3rd place overall as a team. They missed earning the State Academic Championship by .008 points but still earned an Outstanding Academic Team Award."


There were close to 36 people attending even though the weather had turned to an occasional drizzle.

Unplayable Ball: Rule R28

A player may deem his ball unplayable anywhere on the course except when it is in a water hazard Penalty: One stroke with 3 dropping options

A: Drop as near as possible to where the original ball was played. If that was on the teeing ground, with or without a tee.

*B: Drop the ball any distance behind the point where the ball originally lay but on the extension of the line between that point and the hole.

*C: Drop within two club-lengths of the lie of the unplayable ball but not nearer the hole.

*If the ball is in a bunker, you must drop in the bunker if you choose option B or C.
