After the regular season ended, it was on to the NW B/BB/District 1 Tournament. The ladies won the tournament, with the following results: Kate Combs, 4th; Siri Dye, 5th; Nora Zapalac, 6th; Anah-Kate Drahn, 7th; Emalie Hobi, 8th; Naomi Vliet, 12th. With only three players, the men took second place, with Erik Paton 1st, Tobin Arden 2nd, and Sterling Carfrae 5th.

Then it was on to Tri/Quad Districts B/BB, where both the men and women won titles. For the women, Siri Dye earned 6th place, Emalie Hobi 7th, Anah-Kate 10th, and Nora Zapalac 11th; these ladies are going to the State Tournament. Naomi Vliet and Kate Combs did not make it to State, but were instrumental in earning the Quad-Districts championship. For the men, Erik Paton took 2nd place, Tobin Arden 3rd and Sterling took 6th.
