#### From the Pro.....

#### Winter golf

For those of you not going south for winter, here are some ideas to improve your scores in the off season.



Most importantly, the ball does not fly as far in colder weather, so more club is required to go the same distance compared to summer. Combined with less bounce and roll, you may need to hit a 6 iron soon instead of an 8 iron in August. Also, beware of soft turf--the more your feet sink into the ground, the more likely you will chunk your shot. Choke down on the club if you see your feet sinking in or take casual water relief if you see water around your shoes. Bunkers tend to be harder in winter, so less swing with a low bounce wedge will dig into hard sand instead of skipping into the ball.

Winter golf is easier than summer play in several ways. Primarily, chipping and pitching are much easier with softer, slower greens since your ball stops faster. Just land the ball closer to the hole! This also applies to approach shots. Longer hitters should have fewer penalties and chip-outs because the ball bounces less, so fewer chances for trouble.

Finally, course access is much easier, especially at busy venues. Watch for a good day and make a trip to play somewhere new or different.

Experienced winter players will have the following equipment available to make their rounds less weather influenced: waterproof shoes, rain gear for wind or rain, all weather or rain gloves, a bucket hat or umbrella, layering clothes for comfort and movement, hand warmers, and a positive attitude. Go out and challenge yourself to score just as well in poor conditions as you do in pristine weather!


