

Around the course...

Mark Reisinger fills us in on the new pump for number 9

pond. Read his message below.



Update on the installation of the new VFD and pump and motor in #9 pond pump house. Will McDonald, McDonald & Sons Ventures LLC, and I finished up the installation of the new components for our irrigation system today. After testing the system, running irrigation zones from different controllers all over the course, and basic instructions from Mr. McDonald I accepted the system as complete and operational. Benni and I will have some sprinkler head adjustments to perform come next Spring but other than that all systems performed as expected.

Boy, this is going to be something to really look forward to next Spring. As you may recall we moved up one pump and motor size (5hp vs 3hp) to accommodate capacity and lessen stress on the pump/motor to try to increase its longevity. Another advantage may

end up being we can now not worry about running two or more zones at the same time. All the juggling of the times each zone comes "on" during the watering window now is of no concern. Water pressure will remain a steady 77 to 80 psi regardless of the amount of water we are trying to move. We can water a zone from all 4 irrigation controllers at the same time if we wish it so. The water hammer effect we experienced with the old pump is totally gone as the new system is very smooth and much more gentle

upon starting the pump/motor. I am hoping this will help keep our leak count down during the summer months.


Any current leaks will, of course, still be present next Spring so we will continue to hunt those down and repair them as we find them.

We will be locking the pump house door so only trained individuals will be allowed access. Turning off any circuit breakers to engage in repairs of a main line is no longer part of our repair logistics and not necessary. The VFD has total control of the pump so any de-pressurization needed to make repairs on a 2" main line will be done from the VFD.

...and near the # 5 tee boxes

The Great Fill-In is finally happening. The failed pond near the number 5 tee boxes is being filled in with more than our green waste. The Buffum Brothers have a few pond projects now and in their future and we are receiving the fill. A few years back the RIGHT Committee approved the use of this failed pond as a receptacle for the courses green waste. With the idea that it would eventually get filled in. It is cur-



rently about 1/3 of the way filled with more material to come perhaps next summer. For those golfers who have lost their shots into this unretrievable abyss, there is hope soon for a playable landing.

Finally, a new platform for the practice tee

Kit Ledbetter and Gregg Hamilton are working on this new practice tee. Donnie Poole is pouring the 10 foot square concrete slab and a new mat for the top has been ordered. Look for this to be finished very soon. As of this reporting, the pouring of the concrete has begun. Come out soon to see the results.

The #3 pump becomes our backup

We will shut the irrigation system down for the winter next week.
